LID UPDATES & INFO

The Grand Lake Improvement District (LID) needs your help in protecting our beautiful lake from aquatic invasive species.

Grand Lake already has one aquatic invasive species, Curly-leaf Pondweed (CLP) that spreads by "turions" (dormant buds) that form on the plant, sink and lie dormant on the lake bottom during the hottest part of the summer, and then germinate in the fall. Like dandelions in your lawn, you may never be able to get rid of this plant yet with persistence you may be able to manage it so it doesn't take over.

The funds provided through the creation of a *Lake Improvement District* allows us to contract with the lake vegetation control services of Lake Management, Inc. to treat 33 acres of CLP each year. The 33 acres reflects the limit of our Department of Natural Resources permit, and while we cannot eradicate CLP, the goal is the proper management of CLP so the 86 acres of CLP on Grand Lake doesn't continue to spread.

Let me talk about another pesky invasive species that has become more prevalent on Grand Lake. Chinese and Banded Mystery Snails are large, olive colored snails that can form dense aggregations on the bottom sediments of our lake. You may have noticed those that float on the surface of the water until it ends up on your shoreline. I suspect you have noticed that these snails really like each other and give birth to thousands and thousands of young, fully developed snails that suddenly and mysteriously appear. The name "mystery snail" seems appropriate.

How did these snails get here? It is reported that they were imported into live markets in San Francisco in 1892 and were introduced into our waters through the aquarium industry. They can also be introduced to a specific lake when someone dumps their aquarium into the lake or when they are transported via bait buckets and water holding areas on boats. Snail management techniques often include the introduction of fish or turtles that eat snails. Chemical management of snails using copper sulfate is not considered a good option because it is not selective in the snails they kill.

Perhaps a snail feed at *Eddies on Grand*? Believe it or not, these snails are readily imported to Asian food markets.

So what is the LID doing:

1. **Boat Inspections:** The 2017 public access boat inspections on Grand Lake began on Saturday, May 13 and last for 10-hours each Saturday and Sunday through Sunday, September 24th. New for 2017 are Friday inspections that last for 8 hours beginning on June 30th and ending on September 1.
2. **I-LID:** The I-LID is located at our public access and serves as a source of high definition monitoring of the boats that enter or exit Grand Lake, as well as education on the prevention of aquatic species.
3. **Zebra mussel inspection plates:** a number of inspection plates have been placed on docks at strategic points around Grand Lake. These inspection plates attract snails and zebra mussels and allow for early identification by inspectors who monitor these plates on a regular basis.
4. **Treatment for Curly-leaf Pondweed (CLP):** Mechanical harvesting and the use of a DNR approved herbicide like Aquathol is generally used to manage CLP. Grand Lake has tried both and is currently contracting with Lake Management, Inc. to manage CLP.

If you do your homework on aquatic invasive species, you will find that there are there are different invasive plants and animals that have the potential to harm Grand Lake and other Minnesota waters. What can you do to help? I'll mention two things reported by the Stearns County Coalition of Lake Associations and the DNR that would make a difference:

1. Learn to identify aquatic invasive species, and responding quickly to new AIS infestations is critical to curb the spread into other lakes and waterbodies.. If you find something suspicious, note the exact location, take a photo, keep the specimen and contact the local DNR.
2. If you plan to move or sell a dock, lift, or other equipment from one lake to another, all visible aquatic plants and animals must be removed whether they're dead or alive. The equipment must be out of the water for 21 days before it can be placed in another waterbody.

Thanks all for your help in preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species. Enjoy the 4th of July and a wonderful summer.

How to prevent the spread of Invasive Species:

- clean** weeds and debris from your boats, and remove any weeds or mussels, etc.
- drain** your boat, livewells, and baitwells, and keep all drain plugs out while traveling,
- dispose** of unwanted bait in the trash, and
- dry** docks, lifts, swim rafts and other equipment for at least 29 days before placing equipment into another water body.

Stearns County Aquatic Invasive Species Committee has a reward program for you. If you leave equipment that is sold out of the water for 29 days, AIS will reward you with \$200.00.
